Summertime is here and I trust everyone has an enjoyable and safe holiday weekend! With the kids out of school and summer in full swing, everyone is busy - including the Township. The warm weather brings our families to picnics and pool parties, and this season brings the Township to road resurfacing and construction projects.

Rockaway Township aggressively pursues grant opportunities to

offset the cost of large capital projects, and the Township has been very successful in securing grants from the New Jersey Department of Transportation's Transitional Aid program. This year, the Township has received \$205,000 for the resurfacing of a portion of Daniel Street. Engineering work will take place over the next several months with a start date next summer.

In addition to State Department of Transportation funds, the Township receives money from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Clean

Communities program. The monies from the Clean Communities program are used for programs targeted at changing attitudes that cause littering and supporting volunteer efforts to clean up trash throughout our community. The Township was awarded more than \$48,000 this year to support these efforts.

Police Provide Prescription Drug Drop Box



The Rockaway Township Police Department is pleased to announce that they have partnered with Morris County Prevention is Key (www.mcpik.org) to provide Township residents with a Med Return Drop Box. The Drop Box is located in the Police Department lobby, 65 Mt. Hope Road, and is available to residents 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Abuse of prescription drugs is on an all-time rise, and by partnering with Prevention is Key, we are able to provide residents the opportunity to

remove these prescription drugs from their homes and provide them with a safe and secure way of disposing them properly with no questions asked. Through the efforts of this program, our hope is to reduce the risk that these prescription drugs are available to be abused.

The following items will be accepted at the Med Return Box: Prescriptions, Prescription Patches, Prescription Medications, Prescription Ointments, Over the Counter Medications, Vitamins, Samples, and Pet Medications.

Items Not Accepted are – Hydrogen Peroxide, Inhalers, Aerosol Cans, Ointments (Lotions or Liquids,) Meds from Businesses or Clinics, Needles or Sharps of any kind, and Thermometers.

If any Rockaway Township resident has questions about what items will be accepted or not, or has any other question about the Med Drop Box, they may contact the Police Department at 973-625-4000. Someone will be available to answer your questions about this new service to residents. Thank you.

Mayor Michael Dachisen wishes to recognize some standout Rockaway Township employees for their extraordinary efforts in serving the Township and its residents.

Sergeant Rob Scherr of the Rockaway Township Police Department goes above his duties as a police officer by volunteering to clean up litter along Green Pond Road when he is off duty. He takes pride in the community in which he lives and works, and wants to be part of the solution. He has cumulatively picked up over two tons of garbage along the road and continues to do so. Division of Health staff members Susan Sooy, Cara Sileno and Jamie Breiten have for several months gone far above and beyond in helping to restore health and dignity to a resident in significant emotional and physical distress. Division of Health staff not only provided this resident with new resources including mental health services, prescription evaluation, links to therapy and home care, but visited with her on a daily basis, often on their own personal time, and purchased numerous household items for her - always with their own money. In addition, they worked after hours to clean her home, adopt out numerous cats, and even helped the resident pack to move – all the while restoring stability and dignity to this resident's life. While it's difficult to enumerate the effort, time and money that Susan, Cara and Jamie have devoted to this resident's extraordinary needs, their work is exemplary.

Recycling: Cut it and Leave it this Summer

It's simple - just leave your clippings on the lawn when you mow. Grass clippings leave a natural and healthy fertilizer for a growing lawn. Try mulching - a mulching blade chops up grass clippings into fine pieces that slip easily into the soil.

You'll also save money. You won't have to spend money on fertilizer since clippings left on the lawn recycle nutrients such as nitrogen back into the soil.

Clippings do not create thatch in the lawn. Thatch is formed from dead grass roots and stems. The more you fertilize and water your lawn, the faster thatch accumulates.

Grass is collected weekly, Wednesday to Friday. There is no specific collection day. Place grass in a reusable trash container. Please do not mix grass clippings with brush or leaves - it will not be collected.

Some leaf matter is expected but it must be segregated from the bulk of your leaf collection.

Barbecuing: Don't Fall Ill When You Grill!

Now that the sun is shining brightly and we are firing up our barbecues on a routine basis, it's important to follow food safety guidelines to prevent harmful bacteria from multiplying and causing foodborne illness. Use these simple guidelines for grilling food safely!

Defrost Safely

Completely defrost meat and poultry before grilling so it cooks more evenly. Use the refrigerator for slow, safe thawing or thaw sealed packages in cold water. You can microwave defrost if the food

will be placed immediately on the grill.

Marinating

Meat and poultry can be marinated for several hours or days to tenderize or add flavor, but food should be marinated in the refrigerator, not on the counter. If some of the marinade is to be used as a sauce on the cooked food, reserve that portion of the marinade before putting raw meat and poultry in it.

Cook Thoroughly

Cook food thoroughly to destroy harmful bacteria. Meat and poultry cooked on a grill

often browns very fast on the outside. Use a food thermometer to be sure the food has reached a safe internal temperature. Never partially grill meat or poultry and finish cooking later. Please adhere to the following minimum internal temperatures when cooking: Whole poultry - 170°F; Hamburgers - 160°F; Ground poultry - 170°F; Beef, veal & lamb steaks - 145°F; Roasts & chops - 145°F; Pork - 160°F.

Ford-Faesch House Phase III Exterior Construction Project Completed

The Historical Society and Rockaway Township are pleased to report that the final exterior

restoration project is completed. With 2011 grant funds from the Morris County Historic Preservation Trust, the

Ford Faesch House now has all of the doors and windows restored to how they would have looked in 1772 when the house was originally constructed by Col. Jacob Ford (who also built the Ford Mansion in Morristown, Washington's Headquarters, several years later). This final phase of exterior restoration completes an effort that has spanned more than three decades.

The Township and Historical Society wish to express their sincere appreciation to all the individuals, groups and the general public for their support and generosity in saving this critical piece of National and Rockaway Township history.

The Society is now making preparations for the restoration of the interior of the building. The public is encouraged to continue participating in the programs at the house. Please
